Tristan Le Govic - originally from Brittany, Tristan Le Govic is one of the leading Celtic harpers today. During his time living in Ireland, then in Scotland, he developed a deep feeling for Celtic music. Singer, storyteller, virtuoso musician, his repertoire is both traditional and original. He regularly works with

Celtic harpists such as Corrina Hewat, Rachel Hair, Ailie Robertson and Nikolaz Cadoret, as well as with singers, jazz musicians, bass and drums. Tristan is also the publisher of The Breton Harp Anthology, a unique collection of three music books featuring the best harpists in Brittany.
