Nathalie CHATELAIN obtained her teaching diploma in 1986, a Virtuoso Premier Prix with the unanimous congratulations of the Jury in 1988, and a concert diploma in 1990. She perfected her skills with Nicanor Zabaleta, Germaine Lorenzini, Jacqueline Borot and Marielle Nordmann, and also obtained her piano and accompaniment diploma in Geneva.

Nathalie Chatelain has performed as a soloist, in orchestras and with chamber music ensembles throughout France, Switzerland, Germany, Luxembourg, New Caledonia, Canada, Poland, China, Japan, Serbia, at the Purdue Festival in the USA, in Brazil, the Czech Republic, Morocco, Ireland and the Netherlands. She was also long President of the Swiss Harpists Association, and a member of the Board of Directors of the World Harp Congress.

Nathalie Chatelain has recorded nine CDs, and performed many world premiers internationally. Currently living in the South of France, she teaches harp and piano at the EMMC in Mauguio-Carnon.



The young dancer **Anais Bayle** discovered flamenco at the age of ten, in Nîmes. Trained by Eva Luisa and Yurentz Bermudez in France, she regularly travelled to Spain to work with great masters such as Patricia Guerrero, Manuel Liñan, Andrès Peña, José Maya and Rocio Molina. In 2016, she won the first prize at the Valencia Flamenco Competition in France.

Anais Bayle is both dancer and choreographer for many shows such as "Inspiracion Flamenca" in Decazeville, and "Sueños Granainos" at the Albert Camus Centre in Seméac. She teaches and organises numerous workshops in Nîmes and the surrounding area.
